

2010 - 2011 SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION SHEET

The LSAT Preparation Diversity Scholarship Program, sponsored by Bracewell & Giuliani LLP, The Princeton Review, and the minority student organizations at the University of Texas School of Law, was created to provide racially and ethnically diverse law school candidates an increased opportunity for law school admission. It is open to all racially and ethnically diverse college students planning to attend law school. Scholarship recipients will receive the full tuition to attend The Princeton Review's LSAT preparation classroom course. **PLEASE READ ALL INFORMATION CAREFULLY AS INCOMPLETE AND TARDY APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.**

Application Deadline: December 10, 2010

Requirements:

- 1) Applicant must be a racially or ethnically diverse student at a college/ university planning to take the actual LSAT exam. NOTE: The scholarship does not include fees associated with taking the actual LSAT exam. All scholarship recipients are responsible for registering for the LSAT exam;
- 2) Applicant must be within 18 months of graduating obtaining an undergraduate degree or applicant must already have an undergraduate degree;
- 3) Applicant must complete the application, including applicant signature;
- 4) Applicant must provide a copy of college transcripts from any and all colleges attended;
- 5) Applicant must provide two (2) letters of recommendation, preferably one from a professor; and
- 6) Applicant must provide an essay outlining his/her reason for taking the LSAT exam, law school goals, career goals, and other qualifications that make applicant a strong scholarship candidate.
- 7) **OPTIONAL:** Applicant may submit an additional statement regarding any extenuating circumstances that further illustrate why he/she should be considered for this scholarship, including but not limited to financial need, hardships overcome, etc.

Complete and timely applications will be reviewed by the Bracewell & Giuliani LLP Associate Inclusion Committee ("AIC"). All finalists will be notified no later than February 15, 2011 to arrange an interview time with members of the Bracewell & Giuliani LLP Partner Inclusion Committee ("PIC") if necessary. **ALL FINALISTS MUST BE AVAILABLE FOR A PHONE INTERVIEW WITH MEMBERS OF THE PDC DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY FOLLOWING SUBMISSION OF THIS APPLICATION IF NECESSARY.**

All decisions are final. Bracewell & Giuliani LLP and The Princeton Review reserve the right to alter the program at their discretion. All scholarship recipients will be notified no later than March 15, 2011.

Upon acceptance, scholars will be required to submit a nominal \$50.00 refundable deposit/participation fee payable to the Thurgood Marshall Legal Society. **This deposit is only required of the scholarship recipients.** The purpose of this deposit is to ensure that scholars are committed to attending all LSAT preparation courses. This deposit will be refunded if the scholarship recipient attends the LSAT Prep course, and submits his/her actual LSAT score to Bracewell & Giuliani LLP within one month of receiving the score.
